1.		This form is required when (for an interim period) a licence issued by another authority will validate the New Zealand licence requested, without the provision of a New Zealand CAA Medical Certificate.											
2.		The declaration above (13) is so that the holder understands the obligation to ensure medical fitness is maintained to the required standard at any time that the privileges of the licence are to be exercised,											

- and when this cannot be ensured with confidence, to consult with an Aviation Medical Assessor appointed by CAA.
- 3. These requirements are specified in more detail in the Rules mentioned above, and are explained more fully in the Advisory Circulars in sections bearing the same reference number (mainly in AC 67.51). The holder should obtain a copy of this and be familiar with the requirements, but the rule of thumb is - "when in doubt, consult a DME or AMA". To fly without such assurance may affect insurance and other matters.
- 4. Privacy of Information: Civil Aviation Rule Part 67.21 states:
 - Subject to paragraphs (b) and (c), all information provided by or on behalf of an applicant for a medical certificate, which is personal medical information, shall be confidential to the applicant and shall be used only in respect of the medical certificate.
 - Subject to paragraph (c), a registered medical practitioner employed by the Authority shall ensure the protection of information referred to in paragraph (a) that is held by the Director; except that when medical information appears intentionally false or misleading, the medical practitioner shall release to the Director information of relevance to enforcement officers, or officers of judicial bodies for appropriate investigation and action.
 - Nothing in this rule shall derogate from any provision of any other enactment or from any rule of law relating to the confidentiality of information.

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
