Exemption from the Requirement in Civil Aviation Rule CAR 91.249(a)(3)

PURSUANT TO Section 37(2)(b) of the Civil Aviation Act 1990,

- I, Mark Hughes, General Manager Air Transport and Airworthiness, being satisfied that—
 - (a) The action taken by having an approved identifiable paint scheme or markings, that have unique letters or numbers displayed on the aircraft, and a unique personal call sign that incorporates the aircraft type/model and these letters or numbers, is as effective as the requirement in CAR 91.249(a)(3); and
 - (b) the risk to safety will not be significantly increased by the granting of this exemption,

HEREBY EXEMPT—

Pilots in command of New Zealand aircraft

required to communicate by radiotelephony

FROM-

the requirement in Civil Aviation Rule CAR 91.249(a)(3) that if required to communicate by radiotelephony under the Civil Aviation Rules, a pilot-in-command of a New Zealand registered aircraft must use the name of the aircraft manufacturer, or the aircraft model, and the last 3 letters of the aircraft registration marking,

PROVIDED THAT—

- a) The aircraft must have a Civil Aviation Authority approved Identifiable Paint Scheme or Markings, issued in accordance with CAR 47.104; and
- b) The operator must receive Civil Aviation Authority acceptance of the proposed unique personalised call sign; and
- c) The unique personalised call sign must include the aircraft make/model and alphanumeric identification visible on the fuselage of the aircraft.



This exemption shall remain in effect unless withdrawn in writing by the Director.
